## • Food Truck - Tacos MyFren

-Jesus Tapia stated that he would like to have his truck in town on Monday, Thursday and Friday. He would like to have it running Noon until 8p to cover IEC factories and he would like to be near Kabelin's Ace Hardware (Mike from Andy's gave him permission to set up on his lot). Attorney Halpin spoke to Jesus to let him know that he will need to go to St. Joseph County for the Health Department permit. She stated that he can not park on Michigan Street since it is a State Highway. If he gets permission to park in business lots by the owners, then it will be okay with the Town, once he receives his permit. Andrea also let him know that we are working on our Food Truck permit within the Town limits. President Kauffmann stated that we can meet with him again after he retains his St. Joseph County Health Dept. Permit.

# Discover New Carlisle – Façade Grant

-Jen Miller and Carl Brown-Grimm made a small presentation to explain what the Façade Grant is and what it covers. The Town has been donating \$5,000 a year to help with their grant and Discover fund raises the other \$5,000 to give away a \$10,000 grant to businesses. This is a matching grant. They generally do two to three grants a year. They would like to increase their awarded amount due to the increasing prices and hopefully to attract some new businesses into the empty buildings uptown. They are asking for an increase in our donation since the prices are going up. Discover asked if the Town would be willing to increase our donation to \$10,000 a year. President Kauffmann asked for the list of applicants and stated that the Council would discuss it further.

#### Baker-Tilly

-Tyler Coffel presented the Capital Affordability Plan and went through the booklet with the Council.

#### MACOG agreement

-Attorney Halpin stated that the Macog agreement will be a percentage of the total amount of the UDO but not to exceed \$15,000.00. A motion was made to accept the agreement not to exceed \$15,000 by Council Member Abbott and seconded by Council Member Colanese. Motion carried 5-0.

## H&G Proposal for Water Main Relocation

-Public Works Director Mrozinski explained the relocation of the water main to the council. This will eliminate an old line going to Carris Reels, Burnetts' house and Bales, and replace it with a new line around Kate O'Connors and in front of the American Legion. This proposal will also clean the storm lift station and needs to be maintained annually to keep sand

cleaned out. Council Member Pemberton asked if this new line would make a difference with the zoning going on in that area, or will we need a bigger line? Engineer Huss explained that the Town has been working for years to get the businesses and home off that line and this is a good step in the right direction. There will be no additional needs with the zoning. John stated that Marvel Lane to Zigler Street will need to be changed also, hopefully in 2025. Motion was made to accept the bid for \$30,337.00 by Council Member Short and seconded by Council Member Abbott. Motion carried 5-0.
