Clerk-Treasurer Report

-Reported on information for the Splash Pad usages comparing 2023 to 2024. Usage costs for 2023, were approximately \$60,000 to run from July to October. Usage costs for 2024, were approximately \$58,500 to run from May through September. The pad ran from 11am to 7pm (Eastern). The MVH crew lowered the flow Monday-Friday and decreased the run time per cycle. Weekday water flow was 38 GPM, and weekends ran at 45 GPM.
